Signing in is not a screening tool, but a way to record who is present on parish premises—including the church, presbytery, hall, or other areas—during each Mass or parish activity. This record supports safeguarding efforts and is essential in case of emergencies.



We should glory in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, in whom is our salvation, life and resurrection, through whom we are saved and delivered.

FIRST READING:

A reading from the book of Numbers 21:4-9

On the way through the wilderness, the Israelites lost A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 3:13-17 patience. They spoke against God and against Moses, 'Why did you bring us out of Egypt to die in this wilderness? For there is neither bread nor water here; we are sick of this unsatisfying food.'
